### Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held at Brooke Farm on Monday 14th May 2012

It was also reported that the new traffic signals on the A60 had improved traffic flow at the junction but had significantly increased traffic volumes through Linby village. It was reported that Nott's CC had frozen their element of Council Tax for the third year.

Cllr C Hardstaff advised that the accommodation currently has a good rate of occupancy.

**4.3 Village Hall**

Cllr C Bentley reported that the Village Hall had managed to break even for the year.

**4.4 Enterprise Group**

Cllr S Mayes informed the meeting that the Open Gardens event had been successful and the Enterprise Group had made a donation towards the purchase of the new lawn mower and will also be supporting the Diamond Jubilee Event.
