# 7.0 Traffic & Road Safety

The Parish Council reported groups of around 20 to 30 people on scrambler bikes in Annesley Woods. One Councillor reported they were almost knocked over by one of them when out walking. When they leave, they race off towards Newstead Village. The Parish Council advised contacting Newstead Parish Council for information.

#### 8.0 CIL Update / Projects

The Parish Council advised one of the first projects they would like to look at is creating a play area on the field at the Horse & Groom Pub. Cllr Lewis reported he has visited the play park in Woodborough and advised something similar, but smaller scale will be suitable on the pub field. Cllr Lewis and Cllr Ireland to meet with the landlord to discuss further. The PC to look at grants available. Cllr Lewis agreed to contact Nic Wort regarding a tree planting project at the back of the field, and whether any funding is available.

#### 9.0 Hay Feeders Update

Cllr Lewis advised the Hay Feeders and liners are at Reuben Shaws. The new liners for the existing Hay Feeders have not yet arrived and he will check whether the two new barrels have arrived. He advised he will liaise with the Welder regarding attaching them securely to the wall.

# 10.0 Lengthsman Scheme / Green Spaces Maintenance

Cllr Lewis reported the Lengthsman has washed down the docks in preparation for painting. He has cut back the hedge on Church Lane and on the frontage of the Strata Estate. Jobs to do include finishing off sanding and scraping the docks before painting, cutting the hedge around the container at the Heritage Centre and painting the Pit wheel. Cllr Ireland advised the hawthorne bushes near the Pit wheel need cutting back. Cllr Lewis to check if the Lengthsman has the correct equipment and if not, contacting Roger Stillwell. Cllr Harrison advised the large hedge on Wighay Road, just after the ditch, is full of rubbish and car parts. Cllr Lewis to ask the Lengthsman to take a look.

## 11.0 Culverts Inspection Survey - Update

Cllr Barnfather advised Via has confirmed they will meet onsite sometime soon. Cllr Barnfather to confirm the date and meet them onsite with Cllr Lewis. The Parish Council had discussed shortening the grid slightly at the Bottom Cross, however, Cllr Barnfather asked that no action be taken until Via have been out as they will be able to advise on the best action to take.
